

### Our joint working



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In the three years since we were established as part of the National Cancer Vanguard, we have

- Secured over £24m for our population
- Undertaken over 50 projects
- Engaged over 240 clinicians in our pathway groups
- Developed relationships across organisational boundaries to drive transformation at a system level
- Established ourselves as a leading cancer alliance nationally

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#### **Our Achievements**



Top Cancer Alliance for one-year survival, but still variation that we are working to address

Our colorectal redesigned pathway has seen a reduction in DNAs from 20% to 2% as a result of telephone triage





Around 2,000 men have gone through the worldleading, HSJ-award-winning RAPID prostate pathway, with an average of 59% avoiding unnecessary biopsy

Over 11,000 patients in more than 50 hospitals across England are taking part in our NICE FIT research study



By March 2019, over 1,800 people seen for a lung health check in Hammersmith and Fulham and in Hillingdon, which we hope will result in 20 cancers being diagnosed early



Over 28,000 patients have been called to encourage them to participate in bowel screening

Over 400 patients will go through the National Optimal Lung Cancer Pathway across two sites by March 2019



More than 12,000 patients have been triaged by the redesigned colorectal diagnostic pathway

Number 1 ranked Cancer Alliance for system delivery of 62-day standard

Around **450 GPs** attended cancer education events and two further events are planned





Our Patient Advisory Group has contributed to more than **20** initiatives across the year

Over 250 clinicians are using the cancer decision app to improve early diagnosis

We have offered around 880 extended hours cervical screening appointments





#### Our data



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#### We know that

- West London has highest one year survival nationally
- RMP has consistently met the 62 day standard

#### **BUT**

- Only 53.5% diagnosed at stage 1 or 2 in 2016
- Low age-standardised cancer incidence overall, but high incidence when adjusted for ethnicity
- All three screening programs below national standards
- The 28 day Faster Diagnosis Standard will increase pressure on our diagnostic services
